Te tau 1983. These are the inscriptions to be placed on the memorial to Turi, the ancestor of the West Goast tribes, which will be unveiled at Patea to-day, one being the translation of the other. A very big gathering of Maoris has assembled to do honour to-day to the memory of one of the great influences in the colonisation by the Maori of New Zealand. Though the Nagatiruanti and Nagraruur tiples are the main branches of the natives that came with Turi, the effects of the Aotea migration have been widespread. In a way the memorial will serve not only as a memorial of Turi, but also as a reminder of all the intrepid Maori navigators who came to New Zealand long before the pakeha.
