New Church at Mokau Consecrated

Before a large congregation the new Anglican church of St. Peter-by-the-Sea was consecrated at Mokau on Saturday, St. James' Day, by the Rt. Rev. J. T. Holland, Bishop of Waikato.

The bishop, attended by his chaplain, the Rev. G. A. Butt, New Plymouth, was received by the west door by the vicar of Mokau, the Rev. A. B. Pywell, and the churchwardens.

After special dedicatory prayers and

the dedication of a memorial sanctuary chair, the bishop ordered the sentence of consecration to be read by the acting chancellor of the Waikato Diocese, Mr. A. C. Fookes, after which the bishop signed the sentence and ordered the documents to be preserved among the muniments of the diocese. The bishop then declared the church to be consecrated under the name of St. Peter-bythe-Sea. Holy Communion was cele-

vided by the women of the parish the vicar said the church, built last year and dedicated on November 1, was valued at £2000 without furnishings and would seat 110. The actual cost of the building, due to the number of gifts and voluntary

labour, was only £686/19/-.
