The dimensions of the main hall are 60ft by 30ft, and 20ft from floor to ceiling. On each side, there are three class rooms, partitioned off sliding partitions in the front, and swing partitions on the sides, When necessary, these can be swung to the wall and the total floor space taken advantage of. Fifty forms similar to those in the Town Hall, are being made. At the back of the main hall, is the kitchen, in which there is a built-in boiler, with water laid on. The painting is being done by Mr A. Catanach and all the plumbing work, ventilators, etc, by Mr P. C, Young. Like most other builders, Mr Sam Price is being kept exceedingly busy. His tender of over £500 for additions to the Police Station has been accepted and he is about to commence the second house in Luptonville for Mr Wilkie,
