## Post Office ready in a few weeks

NEW PLYMOUTH'S new £265,000 chief post office should be completed within a few weeks. The contractors, the W. Willamson Construction Co. Ltd. are now working on the completten of the ground floor, after having finished work on the wo upper floors.

Most of the furniture and equipment required for the biggest Government building in Taranaki is being assembled at New Plymouth and it should be possible for the Post and Telegraph Department to commence installation within a matter of days.

The architect for the building, Mr. R. A. Syme, said today that the contract was due for completion by August 31. Work started in February, 1956.

Workmen are now putting the finishing touches to the ground floor—erecting the public desks, counters, and other ground floor fittings, and fitting out of the mailroom. These fittings, which have been prefabricated mainly in Christchurch, are being assembled on the job.

Tiling of the main entrance and steps has been completed, and the wide strips of concrete between the footpath in Currie Street and the frontage of the building have been laid. Along the Gill Street frontage, the footpath area will be sealed to the building walls.

The New Zealand crest, which will dominate the entrance to the building is expected to arrive from the makers in the South Island within a few days.
