Arnold Gawith was born on the Lth Movember, 1919, at Hawbra. He received his secondary education at Stratford Technical High School, where he passed his Matriculation Examination. The sports in which he was actively interested were rugby, cricket, tennis and swimming. Prior to his sulistment in the R.N.Z.A.F. he was employed as a cheese maker by the Eltham Dairy Company, Eltham.

Filight Sorgeant dawith applied for service with the R.W.Z.A.F. on the 7th March, 1941, and was enlisted at Rongetal on the 27th March, 1942, where he was employed on ground duties, as a transport driver. On the 27th July, 1942, he was posted to the Initial Fraining Wing, Rotorus, and in October proceeded to No. 2 Elementary Flying Training School, Ashburton, where he commenced his flying training. On the 28th December, 1942, he was posted to No. 1 Service Flying Training School, Wigrem, where he was posted to No. 1 Service Flying Training School, Wigrem, where was premoted to Sorgeant on the 6th May, 1943, and to Flight Sergeant on the 6th November, 1943. He embarked for the United Kingdom on the 29th May, 1943.

Despatch & Receiving Centre, Hrighton, on the 8th July, and or the 5rd of the following month was posted to No. 14 Advanced Flying Unit, With this unit at Banff, Banffshire, and the nearby satellite acrodrome of Dallachy, he carried out air exercises as pilot of Oxford aircraft. On the 19th October, 1945, he was posted to No. 11 Operational Training Unit, Westcott, Buckinghamshire. From this base and the nearby satellite serodrome of Oakley, he crewed up Early in March he proceeded to No. 311 Ferry Training Unit,

Moreton-in-the-March, Cloucesterehire. On the 11th March, he proceeded by Wellington aircraft to Italy via Hurn, Rabat Sale, Medeon Blanche, Catamia, and Gelone, and on arrival was posted to No. 70 Squadron, Torterella, Foggia, West. With this squadron he carried out twelve operational flights, the targets including marshalling yards at Milan, Vicenza and Gempine, in Italy; and Budapest (2), in Hungary; ship installations at Leghorn and Spezia, Sans Stefano (2) and Piombino; and a railway bridge at Latisana, in Italy.

On the night of the 23/24th Mey, 1944, F/Sgt. Gawith was pilot of a Wellington bomber aircraft which took off from Torterella Landing Groupe on air operations against the target of Ferentino, in Italy. The aircraft failed to return to its base and all the members of the crew, including F/Sgt. Gawith, were reported missing. Subsequently his death was officially presumed. Later information received from the Missing Research and Enquiries Unit, stated that F/Sgt. Gawith was buried in the Anzio Beachhead Cemetery, Italy. There were two other New Zealanders in the crew - F/Sgt. Allwright (air bomber) of Wellington and F/Sgt. T. Waaka (W.O/A.G) of Rotorna.
