Any delays in announcing allocation of the remaining portion of Maui gas field were to give the public a chance to comment, the Minister of Energy, Mr Tizard, said vesterday.

He was replying to claims by the Opposition's energy spokesman, Mr Friedlander, that the Government was "dithering" over the allocation.

"If any delays can be blamed on the Government it is solely because the opportunity was taken to consult the public, which responded with an unprecedented 303 sumbissions."

The Energy Advisory Committee had evaluated the submissions and the Government's decision would be amnounced shortly, he said.
